

British Archaeology Style Guide

This guide outlines the conventions and standards for writing and formatting content in *British Archaeology*. Please adhere to the following rules to maintain consistency across the publication.

Centuries

• Write out centuries in words: *sixth century, nineteenth century.*

Dates

• Use "BC" for dates before the Common Era. Do not use "AD" unless there is a specific reason to do so.

Titles

• Generally, titles and headings should be decapitalised, except where specific exceptions apply (e.g., proper nouns).

Punctuation

- Avoid the use of exclamation marks entirely.
- After a colon, use a capital letter.
- Use semicolons, not commas, to separate items in lists introduced by a colon.

Paragraphs (when laid out in QuarkXPress columns)

- Avoid ending paragraphs with a single word (orphan).
- Prevent the same word from repeating on consecutive lines along the left column (e.g., "barrow" should not appear immediately below itself).
- Avoid widows and orphans wherever possible.

Percentages

• Use the symbol (%) rather than writing out the word "percent".

Compass Points

• Use lowercase for compass points: *southwest, northeast,* etc.

Word Usage

• Use "among", "amid", and "while" rather than "amongst", "amidst", or "whilst".

Numbers

- Write out numbers from zero to nine.
- Use numerals for 10 and above: 10, 11, 12.
- For large numbers, use: 1 million, 2 billion.
- Do not begin a sentence with numerals.

Quotations

- Use double quotes for direct quotes: "This is a direct quote."
- Use single quotes for indirect quotes or quotes within quotes: '*This is a quote within a quote.*'

Ellipsis

• Always insert a space after an ellipsis: ... continue the sentence.

Serial Comma

• Use the Oxford comma: apples, oranges, and bananas.

En-dash

• Use a spaced en-dash: word – word.

Seasons

• Seasons should be decapitalised: *spring*, *summer*, *autumn*, *winter*.

Spelling

- Use UK spelling.
- Use -ise endings (e.g., organise), not -ize.
- Use *learnt*, not *learned*.

Common Words

- Grade I, Grade II (initial capitalisation)
- hillfort, LiDAR, reenactors, well-being, Second World War, artefacts
