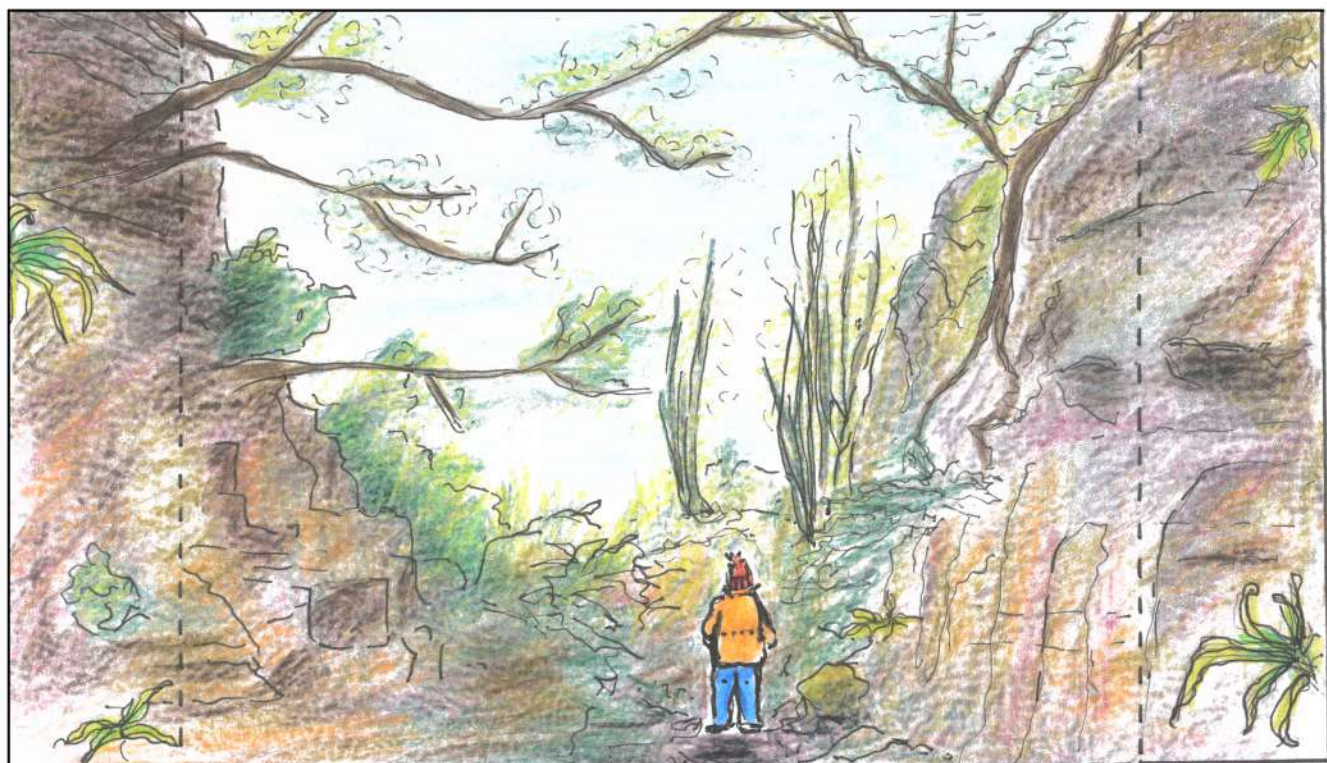
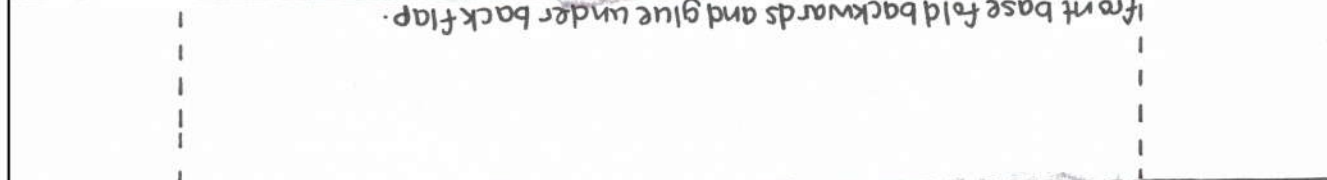

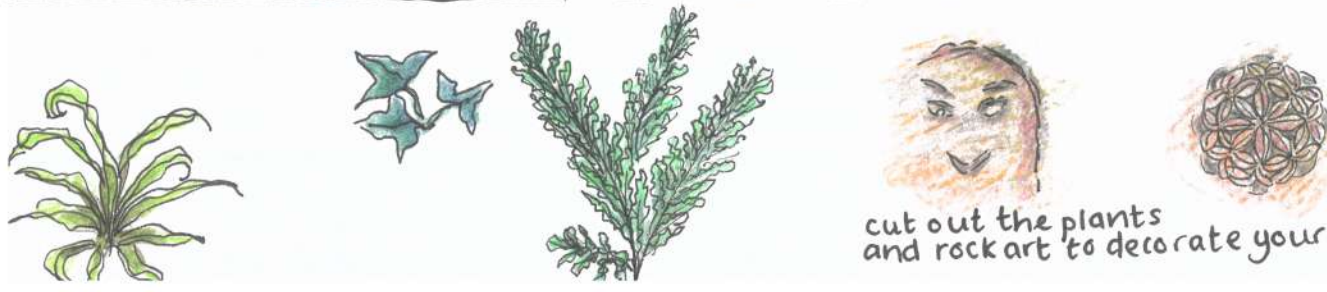

How to make your pocket holloway

1. Score along all the dashed lines _ _ _ _
2. Cut along all the solid lines _____
3. With the back piece, the one which is completely coloured in, fold the base and sides forward to make the ground (colour facing up), and the walls of the Holloway.
4. Use the small square flaps and staples, glue or tape to fix the base and sides together to make a box.
5. With the front piece, cut out the pieces with trees on and along the wiggly U-shaped line.
6. This time fold the front base back and fix this underneath the back base and fold the sides in and fix them too. The coloured part should face outward. You should end up with a box which looks a bit like a cereal box with the front missing.
7. To finish your model, fix the trees to the front where marked with X – they should look like they are growing out of the walls.
8. Now cut out the plants and rock art and stick them to the walls of the holloway to decorate it.
