

## Festival of Archaeology 2023 – Social media volunteers

## **Role description**

The Festival of Archaeology is coordinated by the Council for British Archaeology (CBA). The CBA Festival of Archaeology is the world's largest event celebrating and sharing archaeology, and in 2023 the Festival will take place from 15-30 July. The Festival is co-ordinated by the CBA and made possible by the collaboration of event organisers, large and small. These range from community archaeology groups and individuals to museum services and national organisations.

As a Social Media Volunteer, you will be helping to create and share key information about the CBA Festival of Archaeology and its events with our supporters and create opportunities for us to engage with them. You will be working with our Communications and Marketing Manager to create a range of content for our social media channels and blog. You will get the chance to develop your IT and communication skills, learn about the work of a UK-wide charity and develop your passion and interest in archaeology and heritage. You will also have the chance to attend a Festival event to meet some of Festival organisers and see the impact of your work.

The Council for British Archaeology is an independent educational charity working to promote our vision of 'archaeology for all' where everyone has the opportunity to participate in, and care for, the historic environment. We are a membership organisation and have around 6,500 members and subscribers who also receive our magazine, *British Archaeology*.

We work alongside volunteers in a number of different ways – both at our offices in York and through our projects, such as the UK-wide network of Young Archaeologists' Clubs and through involvement with our regional network of CBA groups.
