

Submitting a blog for A Day in Archaeology
























Intro

Submitting your blog


Click the "Submit now" button.



You will then be asked to login or register with the website. If you need to register it only takes a moment.

If you are a CBA member or a Festival event organiser you will already be registered with the website.






Once you have logged in please accept the terms and conditions.

You will then arrive at the main blog submission form. All fields marked * are compulsory so you will need to complete these in order to be able to submit you blog.

If you need to pause while submitting your information your blog will automatically be saved. See details below on how to edit your blog.



Complete the fields as follows:


Title

Give your blog a memorable title – this is the first thing people will see when browsing the blog submissions so you want yours to stand out. Try not to make it too long.



Historical period

This is used to help filter the resources so people can search and find blogs on different topics and themes. If your blog relates to any historical periods please add these here. You can select as many of the options as you like.



Region

This is used to help filter the resources so people can search and find blogs on different topics and themes. Please select the most appropriate area of the UK for you.

Contact details

Adding a first name, last name and email address is mandatory and these fields will be visible on the blog. If you do not wish to share your own email address please use <u>festival@archaeologyuk.org</u>.

Once you have completed all the relevant fields please click the Next button. You can also opt to save your blog at this point.
















Media links

Author's biography


Please provide a brief biography of the author. This makes your blog a bit more personal and helps readers get a better sense of the range of people that get involved in archaeology and their different backgrounds.

This is the image that people will see when they are searching through the A Day In Archaeology blog posts. It's great to include an image here to make your blog look appealing.


Gallery images

This section relates to our wider Festival resources and isn't directly relevant to A Day In Archaeology so you can skip this section without submitting any details.




Additional questions

Saving your event

Your blog will automatically be saved as you are submitting your details and there is also a button on the bottom right of the screen called 'Save Draft' which you can click at any time to save what you have added so far.



If you need to stop and return to your blog later to continue your submission you can do so at any time. To return to your blog, log in to the website and then go to the Member homepage by clicking My Account in the top right of the webpage and then selecting Member homepage from the dropdown menu.

Once on the Member homepage you should see an option in the right hand menu called My Festival resources. If you click on that you will be able to see a list of any blogs or resources you have submitted.

To return to a draft or edit a blog you have already submitted for approval please click on the View Resource Submission Details button.

You can check through the details you have submitted and if you would like to edit click on the Edit button at the bottom of the screen.

This will take you back to the form where you will be able to edit any details. Once you are finished please re-submit your blog by clicking the Next button until you reach the confirmation of submission page.

Please note you will need to click the button to agree to the terms and conditions each time you return to edit your event.

If you edit your blog it will need to be reapproved by the Festival Team. For more details on blog approvals see below.

Once submitted

Once you have submitted your blog it will be reviewed by a member of the Festival team. If we have any questions about your submission we will email you. Otherwise we will make your blog live as part of the A Day In Archaeology event on Thursday 27 July 2023.

Once approved you should receive an email to confirm that the blog is now live and you will be able to find your blog here https://www.archaeologyuk.org/festival/a-day-in-archaeology.html.

Please do let people know you've contribute by sharing the link to your blog on social media and including the #FestivalOfArchaeology hashtag.

It would also be great if you could encourage other friends and colleagues involved in archaeology to take part. Blog submissions will remain open until the end of the Festival of Archaeology on Sunday 30 July 2023.

Blogs will remain online and accessible throughout the year.
