Submit your blog

By clicking on the 'Next' button your blog will be submitted.

Saving your blog

Your blog will automatically be saved as you are submitting your details and here is also a button on the bottom left of the screen called 'Save Draft' which you can click at any time to save what you have done so far.

If you need to stop and return to your blog later to continue your submission you can do so at any time. To return to your blog, log into the website and then go to Member homepage by clicking My Account in the top right of the webpage and then selecting Member homepage from the dropdown menu.

Once on the Member homepage you should see an option in the right hand menu called My Festival resources. If you click on that you will be able to see a list of any blogs or resources you have submitted.



To return to a draft or edit a blog you have already submitted for approval please click on View resource Submission Details.

To edit your blog, click the Edit button at the bottom of the page. This will take you back to the form where you will be able to make any edits you need.

Once you have finished editing please click the Next button until you reach the submission confirmation page.

Please note you will need to click the button to agree to the Terms and Conditions each time you edit your event.

if you edit your blog it will need to be re-approved by the Festival Team. For more details on blog approvals see below.

Once submitteed

Once you have submitted your blog it will be reviewed by the Festival Team. Blogs will be made live on A Day In Archaeology - 25 July 2024.

Once approved you should receive a confirmation email.

Blog submissions will remain open until the end of the Festival and submitted blogs are available to view throughout the year.
