YOUTUBE



- 1. Go to video manager and click edit
- 2. Select 'card', 'add card', choose 'poll card'
- 3. Edit card with the questions

GO TO WEBINAR



- 1. From dashboard, click '+poll'
- 2. Choose 'multiple choice with one answer'
- 3. Add question and answer range as above, click save

TWITCH



- 1. From dashboard, click 'create new poll'
- 2. Add question and answer range as above, click 'start poll'

FACEBOOK



- 1. From your page, select 'camera' tab and click 'interactive tab' to access polls
- 2. Add question and answer choices, saving, then 'Go Live'.

ZOOM



- 1. Use chat function to add in questions, then explain choices and ask participants to respond with their response
- 2. Save chat

TWITTER



- 1. Click 'tweet' button and click 'add poll' icon
- 2. Add question and choices
- 3. Tweet
