


Haygate

Pexton Moor Blue Trail ●●●

2.6km (1.6 miles)

Outstanding views of the Dalby Dales and Ellerburn along a route winding through a range of woodland habitats.

Low Dalby

Ellerburn Red Trail ●●●

Shorter fully accessible route:
2.8km (1.7 miles)

Longer route:
4.5km (2.8 miles)

An accessible trail which follows roads and hard surfaces and offers easy access to the Ellerburn pond. Fantastic views along the Low Dalby Valley.

Dalby Visitor Centre

Dalby Beck Yellow Trail ●●●

6km (3.7 miles)

This trail with a steep hill leads to the best views over Low Dalby Valley. Extend your walk and enjoy the wildlife hide at Ellerburn pond.

Sneverdale Rigg Rabbit Run ●●●

3.3km (2 miles)

A pleasant walk from the visitor centre with the chance that you may see deer at the viewpoint. The walk takes you past a 'rabbit type', an important part of Dalby's history when rabbits were farmed for fur. Some steep slopes.

High Staindale

Lakeside Trail ●●●

0.6km (0.4 miles)

Accessible trail

This lovely trail circles Staindale Lake along boardwalks and well-surfaced paths. Great views across the water and its abundant resident wildlife.

High Staindale or Crosscliff

Woodcock Way ●●●

Shorter route:

4.8km (3 miles)

Longer route:

7km (4.5 miles)

A circular trail taking in Staindale, Yondhead Rigg and Crosscliff, with fine views across the North York Moors. Mostly forest roads, some uneven paths, some hills. Developed by the Friends of Dalby Forest.

Nissen Hut car park

Nissen Hut Trail ●●●

1km (0.6 miles)

Fully accessible

Follow the waymarkers to reach our Nissen Hut sculpture by Rachel Whiteread DBE, which commemorates the Forestry Commission Centenary in 2019.

Adderstone Field

Adderstone Rigg Trail ●●●

Shorter route:

2.7km (1.7 miles)

Longer route:

4km (2.6 miles)

The naturally sculpted Adder Stone is an eye-catching feature along the Adderstone Rigg Trail. The trail follows forest paths and roads, offering extensive views over the forest.

Crosscliff

Crosscliff View Trail ●●●

0.8km (0.5 miles)

Accessible trail

An easy access trail with extensive views over the moorland from the viewpoint.

Jerry Noddle Viewpoint ●●●

3.8km (2.4 miles)

Accessible trail

Follow the forest road to Jerry Noddle for spectacular views over Upper Langdale Valley. Return on same forest road.

Bickley Gate

Jerry Noddle Trail ○○○

4.5km (2.8 miles)

Follow this circular trail and you'll be rewarded with spectacular views at Jerry Noddle over the Upper Langdale Valley. Mostly forest roads with sections off-road.

Waitcliff Trail ●●●

2km (1.25 miles)

Accessible trail

Enjoy a gentle stroll around the edge of the plateau high above the hamlets of Bickley and Deepdale. There are wonderful viewpoints round the trail, which follow a quiet and level forest road and gravel surfaced paths.

Deepdale Habitat Trail ●●●

2.1km (1.3 miles)

This is a fairly strenuous trail with plenty to see along the way, including a forest nature reserve. This walk has many hilly sections.
